## A Message from Our Pastor

id you know that 25% of people in the United States state that they have no faith background of any kind? That means that 1 out of every 4 people you encounter each and every day, whether you are at work, at school, in your neighborhood, or at the store, have no relationship with Jesus Christ. For that reason I'd like to take this month's

newsletter to give you a few simple, yet practical suggestions for how to impact your friends, your neighbors, your family, and our community for Jesus Christ.

I'd like to admit up front, that most of the wording and content of this article is not my own. It comes from Jonathan Dodson's article "8 Ways to Easily Be Missional" found at *www.vergenetwork.org*.

(1) Spend Time Eating with Others: We all eat 3 meals a day. Why not make a habit of sharing one of those meals each week with someone else? Go to lunch with a co-worker, not by yourself. Invite neighbors and friends over for dinner. If it's too much work to cook a big meal, just order a pizza and put the focus on the conversation. When you go out for a meal, invite others with you. Or take your family to family-style restaurant where you can sit at the table with strangers and strike up a conversation.

(2) Walk, Don't Drive: Make it a practice to get out and walk around the neighborhood. Instead of driving everywhere, walk when you can. And be deliberate in your walk. Say hello to people you don't know. Strike up conversations. Offer to pray for people. Attract attention by walking the dog or taking a 6 pack of pop and sharing. Bring the kids. Make friends. Engage with folks. Get out of the house. Pray as you go. Save some gas. Take better care of your bodies, and get to know the people around you.

(3) Be a Regular: Instead of hopping all over the place for gas,

groceries, restaurants, and coffee, go the same places at the same time of the week. Get to know the staff who are working there. Find out their names. Ask questions about their lives. Hear their stories. Be a regular. Build deep relationships.

(4) Hobby with Others: Pick a hobby that you can share with others. If you have kids, get involved in a school sports league. Play board games with others. Share your hobby by teaching lessons. Teach sewing, piano, violin, guitar, knitting, sports, etc. Form mom groups. Schedule play dates with the neighbor's kids or grandkids. Be prayerful and be intentional. Have fun and be yourself.

(5) Talk to your Co-Workers: Take breaks with intentionality. Go out with your team or task force after work.

Show interest in your co-workers' lives. Pick four or five of them and pray for them each day. Ask them how you can be praying for them and invite them to come to church with you. When they ask about your weekend, tell them about what you learned at church that week.

(6) Volunteer with Non-Profits: Find a non-profit around the Oak Hills community and take one Saturday a month to serve. Bring your friends, neighbors, or small group with you.

(7) **Participate in Community Events:** Instead of playing on your phone, watching TV, or surfing the net, participate in community events. Go to fundraisers, festivals, clean-ups, the park, city council, and school sporting events. Strike up conversations. Pray for the community. Love the people. Participate.

(8) Serve your Neighbors: Help a neighbor by weeding, mowing, building a cabinet, or fixing a car. Stop by the school, the police station, the EMS, or the Fire Station. Ask if there is anything you can do to help.

Don't make the mistake of making "missional" another thing to add to your already busy schedule. Instead, make your existing schedule missional.

#### **Church Conference**


Our annual church conference will be held on Monday, November 14 at 6 p.m. During this time, we will vote on whether to move forward with the sale of the parsonage located at 2701 Ebenezer Road. Pastor Justin, upon receiving his appointment here, opted not to move into the parsonage and instead receives a housing allowance as a part of his compensation package. The administrative board wrestled with whether we should rent or sell, but ultimately opted for selling the parsonage.

Renting does not appear to be a viable option at this time for at least two reasons: (1) the home needs extensive repairs which the church cannot afford, and (2) there isn't anyone in our congregation who desires to serve as a landlord. Selling makes more sense for several reasons: (1) The housing market is hot. (2) The price of homes in our zip code continues to rise. (3) The renovations needed to make the home marketable are not as great as they are for renting. (4) We anticipate that proceeds would likely generate between \$270,000 and \$300,000 in income that could be used to offset the cost of repairs and improvements that will be needed in the upcoming years of the church's existence, among them a new church roof.

All official members of Oak Hills United Methodist Church have voice and vote in this matter. We invite you to pray, encourage you to ask any questions, and ask that you come prepared to act on this matter.

son has lived in Florida awhile, and took the family to the East Coast. The wait for the storm's arrival is tedious and time passes slowly. My niece who also lives in Ft. Myers said that "Waiting for a hurricane to land is like being stalked by a turtle!"

I know you all have seen many pictures of the devastation—particularly in Southwest Florida. Our building had a 7-foot water surge which gushed into the ground floor and ruined the lobby and drowned over 30 cars in the garage—including ours. The kids' house was spared the surge, but they may not have power for a while and are still with cousins. But we are fortunate—many people lost everything!

Years ago Anne Lamott wrote a book on prayer titled, *Help! Thanks! Wow!* (Penguin Group USA, New York, NY, 2012). Although I don't agree with all of her theology, I do like her practical way of communing with God. This book title is her ultimate prayer—use your own modifiers.


Help those who are hurting!
