Summer is finally here. Summer is an interesting time in the life of the church. Some people are so busy that we rarely see them. It's a season filled with vacations, camping, travelling, grilling out, and enjoying the summer weather. Kids are home from school so it's a good time to enjoy family and get away.

Let's face it. It's easy to get caught up with life in our summer vacation plans and get lazy with our faith during the summer months. I see it happen every single year. People who are in the habit of attending church every week, stop going. It usually starts with "legitimate" reasons, centered around work, or family, or play. But after a while it starts to become the new norm. New habits begin to form. And faith ends up fading into the background not just for the season, but permanently.

Summer shouldn't be a season to take a vacation from your faith. Summer shouldn't be a time to stop growing or to stop giving. Summer should be the time to press in and grow in our faith. It should be the time we devote ourselves to next steps and take on new spiritual practices that further our growth because we have the time and the space to do it!

As we enter into this summer season, I want to challenge you to use this summer to invest in your faith in new ways. Take the time to adopt a new spiritual discipline. Find a quiet spot outside in the beauty of the weather to meet with God. Take time to read through the Bible and pray. When you are home, make it a priority to be here. Hebrews 10:25 says: "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

I wonder: As you start to think about your summer plans, where does Jesus rank in your priorities? Will he go with you on vacation or will a break from school and work mean a break from him as well?

When it comes to our own personal spiritual growth, prayer may very well be the most powerful and most under-utilized tool in our arsenal. Most of the time, when we pray, we pray comfortable prayers. We pray for healing. We pray for God to watch over us. We ask for God's blessing. Yet, if we look at the prayers in the Bible, the prayers that we see are inherently dangerous, not safe. Over the next few weeks, we will be in a new series called The Prayer Dare. Throughout this series, I want to challenge our church to pray some really specific prayers over our lives. We will ask God to search us, to break us, to fill us, to lead us, and to send us. These are not easy prayers. They are hard prayers to pray. They are prayers for people who want to go deeper in their faith and truly make Jesus their one thing. They are the kinds of prayers that God uses to really change us. To pray these prayers is going to take guts. But if we step out and actually begin to pray like this, our faith and our church will never be the same again.

Administrative Board Topics of Interest

(1) On Tuesday, June 27 at 7 p.m., there will be an informational meeting to discuss and ask questions about possible disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. It will be led by our District Superintendent, Rev. Jenn Lucas. The purpose of the discussion is to keep you informed of what is going on in the UMC, our options, and to discern whether or not we should take steps toward disaffiliating from the UMC at this time. A vote will NOT be taken at this meeting. Any potential disaffiliation would require a 2/3 majority vote of all official church members present at a duly called Church Conference at a later time. Non-members would have a voice, but no vote if such a vote were to occur in the future. If you are not a member and want to become an official member of the church please see Pastor Justin about membership.

(2) We would like to begin telling the story of what God is doing in the various ministries of the church. If you have a story of how God has moved in your ministry please share it in writing with Pastor Justin.

(3) The trustees have received bids to replace the boiler and repair the roof. We will use funds from the sale of the Ebenezer parsonage to cover these expenses. However, if you would like to give to these projects, above and beyond your normal tithes and offerings, you are encouraged to do so.

(4) Finances for the first quarter came in with a net loss of \$1,775 due to a strong month of giving and the receipt of our first quarter grant income during the month of March. April was the weakest giving month of the year, bringing in only \$11,589 with expenses totaling \$16,264, resulting in a loss of \$4,675. We would ask you to remain faithful in giving and meeting your pledges as we move into the summer.

(5) We are encouraging each person in the church to consider sponsoring a child for VBS.

(6) All kids and youth ministry workers have had their background checks updated.

(7) Due to growth in the number of people being served at Sissy's pantry, we are in need of donations of nonperishable canned goods. Our kids will be doing a food drive during Vacation Bible School this year

Join Oak Hills United Methodist Church and Legacy Christian Church in Harrison as we join together for a fun faith-filled experience of a lifetime. Pastor Justin Fuhrmann and Pastor Mark Garrett will be leading us as we tour the Holy Lands with Medji Tours from October 23-31, 2023. We'll take a boat ride in the Sea of Galilee.
