Well, it's August and that means two things: the end of another summer and the start of another school year. For Melissa and I, that means that we now have a senior and in just a year our first child will be out of the home. We are already knee deep in college applications and scholarships as we begin this year!

The new school year also marks an important time for ministry in the life of the church. As people return from vacation, it marks a time when people often will make new commitments whether to get involved in a small group or to serve in some way in the church. Over the past two years of ministry together we have made community outreach and involvement a major priority in the church. Over the last two years, we have worked closely with the principals, the students, and the teachers at Springmyer and Oakdale Elementaries through assistance with food and hygiene items as well as through time in the classroom. This generally entails being in the classroom for about an hour each week and working one on one or in small groups with children. In the group I am in, I assist with helping first graders with reading and in helping second graders with sight words and by playing fun games with them. We also have assisted in book fairs and with the financial literacy program at Springmyer and did a movie night at Oakdale. It really is rewarding to invest in the lives of children. You don't have to know a whole lot to be able to love kids. The only requirement is that you do a background check and be willing to show up once a week or once a month (depending on the needs of the teacher and the number of folks in each class).

The other major project we have in the works right now is our after school ministry. The vision for this project came as Ali worked closely with high school students through the morning Bible study we launched at the schools last year. The students wanted a place close-by they could hang out with friends after school. That led to us applying for grant funding to refurbish Wilke chapel

and turn it into a new youth space with ping-pong table, foosball table, video games, board games and the like. We plan to launch this new ministry on Thursdays beginning September 12, from 3-4:30 p.m. in Wilke chapel. We would ask you to be in prayer for this ministry this month. In addition, we are looking for volunteers to serve on Thursday afternoons. If you are able to help in any way, please contact Ali at 513-923-7253.

Finally, as always, I would encourage you to keep being in conversation with your family, neighbors, and friends. Invite them to come. Churches that grow are invitational and are invested in the community!

Jurisdictional Conference 2024 Report

The North Central Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church met July 10-13. 2024 in Sioux Falls. South Dakota. The Jurisdictional Conference is a regional body charged with the election and appointment of bishops within the jurisdiction. The North Central Jurisdiction includes 10 Annual Conferences: Dakotas, East Ohio, Illinois Great Rivers, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Northen Illinois, West Ohio, and Wisconsin. Equal numbers of lay and clergy delegates are elected by each Annual Conference with clergy members voting for clergy delegates and lay members voting for lay delegates. As determined by the General Conference in May, there were no new elections of bishops in the United States this year. However, there is one important thing to share from this year's conference: With Bishop Palmer's retirement on September 1, 2024, East and West Ohio will move to a shared bishop, Bishop Hee-Soo Jung has been named as the Bishop of the East and West Ohio Conferences for the next quadrennium.

Currently Bishop Jung is the resident bishop of the Wisconsin Annual Conference, where he has served since 2012. Before that he served as bishop of the Northern Illinois Conference for 8 years. Previously, Bishop Jung was ordained as an elder in the Wisconsin Conference, serving as a pastor in congregations in Wisconsin, California, Texas, and South Korea. He also served as District Superintendent in Wisconsin. He has served as president of the General Board of Global Ministries since 2016 and chair of the United Methodist Korean National Plan since 2012. Under his guidance, multiple language versions of the small group "Longing to Meet You" was developed. He has served as the chair of the Department of Religion and Philosophy at Kangnam University in South Korea, a member of the Ecumenical Forum for Korea at Geneva, Switzerland, and is actively involved in Korea peace and reconciliation efforts. He has served as faculty for the Five Day

and Two Year Academy for Spiritual Formation since 2005. Previously, he served as president of the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), member of the Board of Directors for the General Board of Discipleship, the United Methodist National Hispanic Plan, the Commission on Christian Unity and Interreligious Conference, the General Commission of United Methodist Men, and Just Peace. He is currently Adjunct Professor at Yonsei University in South Korea and Claremont School of Theology. He TOGA: 1st and 3rd Thursday. earned his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He also holds an M.A. from the Graduate Theological Union in Berkely, CA; an M.A. from the Dongguk University Graduate School in Seoul, South Korea, and a B.Th. from the Methodist Theological Seminary in Seoul, South Korea.

His wife, Im-Hyon, is an elder in the Wisconsin Conference and currently serves as the director of International Relations, Asia and Global Programs, for the Upper Room/Discipleship Ministries. They have two adult sons Jae-Hugh and Jae-Joon, who is married to Brittney, and one granddaughter, Syd-

Administrative Board Topics of Interest

1) We continued our work on discipleship by forming a consensus picture of what our definition of a disciple looks like. As a reminder, we believe a disciple is an obedient follower of Jesus Christ, who is becoming more like Jesus in word and in deed; they love and serve God and his people and are reproducing that same kind of life in other people. In the picture below we see a hand, representing the service of a disciple. On the hand is a heart, represented the love of a disciple. The cross, representing Christ, is at the center of it all. Each finger represents one of the characteristics of our definition: obedience, surrender (a necessity to become more like Jesus and less like ourselves), loving God, loving people, and service. The arrows and the small hands/hearts reflect the how that same life is reproduced in the life of other people. And this God's time (watch).



2) At the permission of the District Superintendent and the District Committee on Building and Location, we have decided to move forward with the sale of the lot behind the garage to Home City Ice. They made an offer of \$130,000 for former Penn property—the back lot with the wooden playground. This is a lot that we generally only use one time a year during our Easter party. Home City Ice already owns the barber shop lot. There will be a special church conference on August 25, 2024 @12pm for the purpose of voting on the sale of this land. Anyone who is an official member of the church is eligible to vote at this special church conference. If you are interested in be-

coming an official member of the church please see Pastor Justin. Please address any questions you may have regarding the sale to either Bob Schloss or Anthony Smith.

- 3) The trustees are working on a water mitigation project for the old parsonage due to heavy leaking when it rains. This project is estimated to cost around \$11,500. Funds will come from capital proceeds from the sale of the Ebeneezer parsonage last year. This means, it will now take around two years to break even on the rental property next door with all the repairs that were needed to make it livable.
- 4) The trustees are beginning to plan for the painting of the fellowship hall later this fall.
- 5) We received clarity from Bob Schloss on his Mothwhole process of becoming like Jesus happens in er's Day commitment to update the women's lounge in the pantry downstairs. Funds for that project will not come from church funds.
 - **6)** Finances continue to run in the red each month. Once we take out the capital expenses that are funded by the sale of the Ebeneezer parsonage we are running short by just shy of \$1,500 per month. Once again we would ask for you to please give faithfully by offering that tithe (first 10%) back to God.
 - ***We would like to request that everybody please pick up after themselves and put things away where they belong when you are finished using them. Your mother does not live here. We want to establish a culture of hospitality and respect that says I will leave a space better than I found it for the next group.

2024-2025 School Year Assistance: The 2024-2025 school year is gearing up and once again we will be helping out at Springmyer Elementary School.
