#### Pastor Article

It is with great joy that I write to notify you of our upcoming fall stewardship campaign. Our theme for this year's campaign is "Investing in Eternity." The fact is we all invest in what we deem to be important. Our investments define our cares, our concerns, our values, and our priorities. The greater the investment is, the greater we declare its importance and value for our life. If we want to know what's really important, all we have to do is consider how we are using our time, our talents, and our treasures. The real question is: What are we investing in? Are we investing in ourselves or are we investing in eternity? Our theme verse for this year's campaign puts it this way: "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where you treasure is, there your heart will be also. ... No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other" (Matthew 6:19-21, 24). I wonder: What are you really investing in? Are you truly investing in eternity?

Once again, this year's campaign will use Herb Miller's *Consecration Sunday. Consecration Sunday* is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual growth, rather than the need of the church to receive. Churches that approach stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view money merely as a way to pay their bills, but as part of

Year to date we have a loss of \$33,713 or \$4,214 per month. As we enter into our annual stewardship campaign this month, we would ask each person to dig deep and take one step up in giving to the Lord.
